You can make small additions to your existing solar panel system, but a major expansion will switch your status to NEM 3.0. You may be able to add a few panels and remain a NEM 2.0 customer (minor additions up to 1 kW or 10% of your original system size).

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

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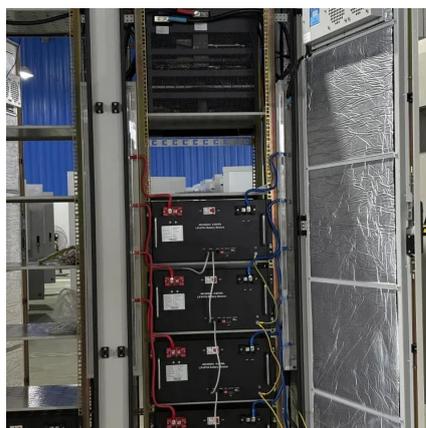
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
